



Proclamation

EAS: Minnesota's forests were an important part of the settlement and growth of the state; and

EAS: The resources and products of the forest are a major part of the state's economy today; and

EAS: Today's forester continually protects, develops, utilizes, and manages Minnesota's forests in an efficient way; and

EAS: The Forestry Club of the University of Minnesota annually honors the forestry profession; and

THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota hereby proclaim Friday, January 25, 1980, to be

FORESTERS' DAY

Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to give this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all citizens to consider the important contributions of the forestry profession to the well-being of our state.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
