

## Proclamation

WHEREAS: Our children and youth are Minnesota's greatest resource; and

WHEREAS: Education should foster the development of recognized potential abilities in the areas of intelligence, creativity, academics, leader-ship, and visual and performing arts; and

WHEREAS: The finding, maintaining, and furthering of these unusual human resources are primary concerns and obligations of the State of Minnesota and its educational systems; and

- WHEREAS: Minnesota has thousands of gifted and talented children whose full potential can only be tapped through the far-sighted cooperation of educators, the community, and government; and
- WHEREAS: Maximum development of each individual's intellectual and creative powers ensures that the challenges of the future can be met; and
- WHEREAS: The Minnesota Council for Gifted and Talented Children is holding its annual conference on February 29 and March 1, 1980;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of February 24 through March 2, 1980, to be

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all local and state educational agencies and the citizens of this state to consider how our schools might best serve these pupils.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
