

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Land Surveyors Association will hold its 28th Annual Convention at Bloomington, Minnesota on February 13, 14, 15, and 16, 1980; and

WHEREAS: The land surveying profession has been a vital part of the civilized world since man first began to till the soil; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Land Surveyor Association, as an organization adheres to a strict code of ethics which emphasizes that the surveyor must place service before profit and hold public interest above his own; and

WHEREAS: In view of the importance of the land surveying profession to this State and the Nation, it is fitting and proper that this profession be given official recognition;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of February 10 through 16, 1980 to be

LAND SURVEYORS WEEK

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge the citizens of this State to recognize the importance of those involved in this profession.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
