

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The National Council of Jewish Women, through its 86 years of providing service, education and social action, has upheld our democratic traditions and has sought to protect American freedoms through its many and varied programs; and

WHEREAS: The vitality and purpose and dedicated efforts of the National Council of Jewish Women have helped to improve our schools, our government, and our health and welfare services in Minnesota and in other states throughout the country; and

WHEREAS: It is evident that to meet the serious challenges our society will encounter in the future, it is vital to have the creativity and skills of the dedicated women who devote themselves to community needs; and

WHEREAS: The members of the National Council of Jewish Women have made outstanding leadership efforts to achieve equal rights and opportunities for women.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of January 14 through January 20, 1980 as

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF JEWISH WOMEN WEEK

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge the citizens of this state to acknowledge these women in their efforts to further freedom and human dignity.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
