

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Since 1950, the Minnesota Jaycees have been sponsor of the Ten Outstanding Young Minnesotans (TOYM) program; and

WHEREAS: This program has provided recognition for young Minnesotans, male and female between the ages of 18 and 36, who have provided outstanding community service within the state; and

WHEREAS: The program, in recognizing those who are the emerging leaders of the state can motivate them to further positive action, which is demonstrated by the fact that former honorees have gone on to be the Vice President, senators, governors, major corporate executives and inspirational community leaders; and

WHEREAS: By providing a forum for these emerging leaders to have their stories told, others may be motivated to emulate their accomplishments, thereby multipling the common good for the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 9, 1980, as

TEN OUTSTANDING YOUNG MINNESOTANS DAY

In Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all citizens to recognize the accomplishments of the program, the Minnesota Jaycees as sponsors, and the ten emerging leaders selected on that date and their contribution to the future growth and enrichment of all citizens.
