



Proclamation

Preparing for emergencies and disasters is a function of government, dependent upon leadership of the executive officers and the efforts of many dedicated volunteers and professionals; and

The past few winters have been severe and resulted in many fatalities; and

Traffic accidents due to snowy or icy road conditions have caused many traffic injuries and the loss of life; and

Livestock losses can be higher than normal due to several weather conditions; and

A number of federal, state, local and private agencies are attempting to inform and educate the public on protective measures that should be taken to prepare for the 1980 Winter season; and

By taking reasonable precautions the citizens of Minnesota can reduce the loss of life and property, plus decrease the adverse effects of winter on our energy resources and our economy;

WHEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 13, 1980, as

WINTER PREPAREDNESS DAY

Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to disseminate this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I urge all agencies of our government to provide citizens with appropriate preparedness and winter survival information for the 1980-1981 winter season. I urge all citizens to cooperate actively with Disaster Preparedness agencies and officials in this important work.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
