

Proclamation

WHEREAS: We live in an age of advance technology and mechanization, which imposes challenges and strains on us and our successors; and

WHEREAS: Clear minds are required to make difficult decisions, operate complex machinery, provide courageous programs to right society's inequities, and maintain a concerned perspective on the future; and

WHEREAS: The body, the mind, and the spirit of the individual can be impaired by the use of alcohol, drugs, and tobacco; and

WHEREAS: The use of these substances can impede societal progress and stability by contributing to traffic fatalities, broken relationships, and crime;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of April 21 through April 27, 1980, to be

YOUTH TEMPERANCE EDUCATION WEEK

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all citizens to reflect on the need for clear-thinking far-sighted leaders in our comtemporary society.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
