WHEREAS: Children are our most valuable national resource; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Children's Health Center, which opened in 1973, began a crusade for a health facility specifically and exclusively for children; and

WHEREAS: This hospital for children encompasses the joy that follows a happy release of pain from a chronic childhood illness or accident and, also, some of the burdens that sick children and their families must bear; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Children's Health Center will celebrate its 7th Birthday on Saturday, February 2, 1980; and

WHEREAS: Children's Health Center and Hospital is equipped to cope with any disability whether it be behavioral problems or open heart surgery; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Saturday, February 2, 1980, to be

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same.
