



Proclamation

WHEREAS: The importance of honesty, self reliance, and respect have never been more significant; and

WHEREAS: The achievements of Scouting are the result of a partnership among the Scouting movement and the schools, churches, Civic clubs, fraternal bodies, and other community organizations; and

WHEREAS: Scouting's role in the conservation of energy and other natural resources is recognized as an important service to our nation; and

WHEREAS: The Cub Scout Promise, Scout Oath, and Explorer Code, give young people today standards and principles they understand and can pattern their lives after; and

WHEREAS: The Scouting program which results in character development, citizenship training, and physical and mental fitness is dependent on the dedicated service of Cubmasters, Scoutmasters, Explorer Advisors, Den Leaders, and others in positions of leadership.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 4 through 10, 1980, to be

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge the citizens of the State of Minnesota to recognize the contributions the Boy Scouts of America and its members have made to our state.

FURTHERMORE, I do hereby commend them on the occasion of the Cub Scout program's 50th anniversary.
