



# Proclamation

WHEREAS: The people of Minnesota have a tradition of providing a meaningful life for all their citizens; and

WHEREAS: Persons who suffer the effects of strokes and their families need the support of others in their community as they adjust to new daily living patterns; and

WHEREAS: Stroke Clubs offer information and advice as well as encouragement and inspiration to stroke persons and their families, helping them to face the disability with courage so that recovery may be maximum; and

WHEREAS: A statewide network of Courage Stroke Clubs will increase public awareness and support while uniting the efforts of persons with strokes and their families to achieve a full and meaningful life in Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim March 28, 1980, as

## COURAGE STROKE CLUB DAY

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all citizens to commemorate this day and plan events to support Stroke Clubs and the families they serve.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fifth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
