

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The United States Postal Service has designated the week of February 24 through March 1, 1980 as National Letter Writing Week; and

WHEREAS: The objective of this observance is to direct the attention of the general public to the power of the written word in shaping opinions, lifting spirits, bridging distances between loved ones, and preserving memories; and

WHEREAS: Public libraries, business groups, trade associations, school teachers, students and the national media will participate in this observance;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of February 24 through March 1, 1980, as

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further encourage all citizens to join in this program by writing letters to loved ones and to those who are separated from us today.
