

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The world is a better place because it contains a great variety of wildlife; and

WHEREAS: Wildlife is important to man and is important in itself as part of Nature; and

WHEREAS: Wildlife must have good habitat to survive; and

WHEREAS: Habitat loss proceeds steadily all around us; and

WHEREAS: Man has the power to protect habitat from further deterioration so that wildlife can continue to exist in its infinite variety; and

WHEREAS: The period of March 16 through 22, 1980, has been set aside as a special time to concentrate our attention on the need to "Save A Place For Wildlife";

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim March 16, through 22, 1980, to be

NATIONAL WILDLIFE WEEK

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all citizens of the State of Minnesota to unite in support of every activity that will help "Save A Place for Wildlife".

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fifth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
