WHEREAS: Vocational Industrial Clubs of America is a national organization for young men and women enrolled in vocational industrial education programs; and

WHEREAS: The goal of the Vocational Industrial Clubs of America is to help students with interests in the trade, industrial, technical or health care fields become happy, mature, productive citizens; and

WHEREAS: Vocational Industrial Clubs of America programs emphasize respect for the dignity of work, high standards in trade ethics, workmanship, scholarship and safety, and

WHEREAS: Vocational Industrial Clubs of America strives to develop each student's social and leadership abilities as well as the student's skills;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim February 10 through February 16, 1980, to be

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same.
