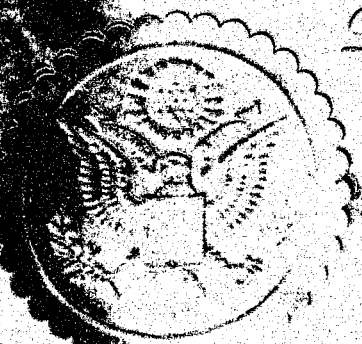
To all whom it may concern:

I do hereby recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such
functions, powers and privileges as are allowed to Consuls by the laws of Nations,
or by the laws of the United States. —

In testimony whereof, I have caused these Letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the
United States to be hereunto affixed.

Done at the City of Washington, this — thirty-first — day of — January, —
in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and — twenty-five, — and of the
Independence of the United States of America, the one hundred and forty-ninth. —

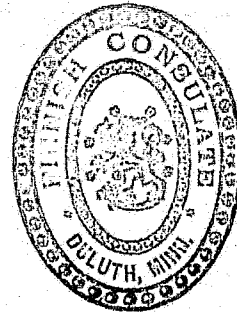

K A R L J U H O S T A H L B E R G,
President of the Republic of Finland,

do by these presents make known that, in order to promote the relations of friendship and commerce existing between the Republic of Finland and the United States of America, I have deemed advisable and expedient by this open letter of credence to constitute and appoint

MR. AARO JOHANNES JALKANEN

Consul of the Republic of Finland at Duluth, Minnesota.

Fully convinced that the Government of the United States of America kindly agrees to recognize and receive him to this office, I ask each and everyone, and especially the authorities of the state where he has his office, kindly and with confidence to extend to him all the assistance he may need in the exercise of his duties, and to grant to him the favors and privileges implied by his office and granted to the consuls of other nations.

Given in Helsingfors on the 23rd day of December, 1924.
