WHEREAS: The study of astronomy was the forerunner of all scientific endeavors; and

WHEREAS: The study and contemplation of the Heavens is rewarding to scientists and layman, alike; and

WHEREAS: April 26 is being observed as Astronomy Day by astronomers all across the country; and

WHEREAS: The Minnesota Astronomical Society will in observance of Astronomy Day, have a display in Southdale Shopping Center and observation of the planets at Como Park Conservatory in St. Paul, and Pearl Neighborhood Center in Minneapolis; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Saturday, April 26, 1980, as

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further encourage the citizens of the state to participate in the activities observing this day.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capital this eleventh day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
