

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Courage Center programs our serving more than 15,900 people with physical disabilities in the upper midwest; and

WHEREAS: Courage Center aims to increase public awareness of the needs, accomplishments, and aspirations of people with disabilities; and

WHEREAS: In order to call attention to the courage shown by people with disabilities who succeed, despite disabilities, we recognize the week of April 20 through April 26, 1980, to be Courage Week in Minnesota;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of April 20 through April 26, 1980, to be

COURAGE WEEK

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge the citizens of the State of Minnesota to recognize the comprehensive network of rehabilitation and camping programs that Courage Center provides for children and adults with physical disabilities.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eleventh day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
