

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The health of all Americans depends upon educated minds and trained hands; and

WHEREAS: The practice of modern medicine at the life conserving standards we now enjoy would be impossible without the scientific tests performed daily in the Medical Laboratory; and

WHEREAS: Maintenance of these standards and progress towards improvement in the quality of laboratory services depends on the dedicated efforts of professional practitioners of Laboratory Science; and

WHEREAS: Through this dedication, the Medical Laboratories of the United States have made a vital contribution to the quality of patient care;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 13 through April 19, 1980, to be

NATIONAL MEDICAL LABORATORY WEEK

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all citizens to recognize and support the vital service provided by the Medical Laboratory for the benefit of all citizens.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eleventh day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
