

Proclamation

WHEREAS: It is fitting that we gain a better understanding of the role played by our nursing students in all phases of community life; and

WHEREAS: The contributions to the health and well-being of our citizens made by the nursing student extends far above and beyond the purview of our hospitals; and

WHEREAS: Nursing as a profession offers many avenues of service as well as useful lifetime preparation in whatever capacity the nurse may be called upon to serve; and

WHEREAS: There is a pressing need for greater numbers of qualified nursing personnel, a need which will continue to grow as medical services expand to meet the requirements of our increasing population and scientific and medical advances;

THEREFORE, I, Albert H, Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do NOW, hereby proclaim the week of March 2 through March 9, 1980, to be

NURSING STUDENT WEEK

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all citizens to honor and encourage those young persons who have elected a career in the field of nursing, and to recognize both their outstanding contribution to our standard of living and their service to citizens of our state.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eleventh day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
