



Proclamation

WHEREAS: The Word Processing Association of Minnesota, Inc., is sponsoring their 7th Annual Symposium and Exhibition of Word Processing equipment at the Leamington Hotel in Minneapolis on April 29 and 30, 1980; and

WHEREAS: Word Processing, which has gained national acceptance, evolved as a means of responding to the concerns of government and industry over the increasing cost of clerical personnel, office equipment and space, plus the sky-rocketing volume of paper work; and

WHEREAS: Word Processing promotes the influence of Affirmative Action and Equal Employment Opportunities in government and industry and is paving the way toward a changing environment and career opportunities; and
