*HEREAS: Minnesota's older adults are a valuable storehouse of experience, wisdom, and tested ability, deserving of respect and admiration for the love, patience, hope, and guidance they have shown their families, friends, and neighbors throughout their lives; and

THEREAS: The strivings of Minnesota's older adults to develop our state's resources yet maintain its considerable natural beauty have resulted in an environment that is the envy of the nation; and

HEREAS: Their prudence and far - sightedness have given us a strong economic base to support our present population and provide opportunities for future generations; and

HEREAS: Minnesota's older adults deserve special thanks for their efforts that have yielded our present well-being, and every opportunity to contribute to the future of their state; and

HEREAS: The first major activity for the 1981 White House Conference on Aging will be a series of community forums occuring during Older Americans Month in May, 1980, where cooperation and commitment will be needed from a variety of groups to have an effect upon the aging community;

OW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota do ereby proclaim the month of May, 1980, to be
