WHEREAS: Social problems continue to impede our society's progress toward a productive and rewarding life for every citizen; and

WHEREAS: Trained professional social workers are addressing our human problems directly and effectively in both crisis and everyday situations; and

WHEREAS: These professionals need the informed support of our community to continually maintain and improve the quality of social services to individuals and groups; and

WHEREAS: The 87th Annual Welfare Conference of the Minnesota Social Service Association (MSSA) will take place March 30 through April 2, in Minneapolis;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of March, 1980, to be

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge the citizens of the State of Minnesota to join the Minnesota Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers in this observance.
