

## Proclamation

WHEREAS: The great discovery of the New World in 1492 was made possible through support from Queen Isabella; and

WHEREAS: That voyage opened North and South America to settlement and development of European nations, laying the foundations for contemporary American societies; and

WHEREAS: The Daughters of Isabella is an international fraternal organization of Catholic women who are organized to do worldwide charity;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, April 22, 1980, to be

## QUEEN ISABELLA DAY

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further encourage citizens of the State of Minnesota to observe this day with appropriate ceremonies.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, we have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eleventh day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
