WHEREAS: All young people are creative by nature, and enthusiastically express themselves through a variety of artistic means; and

WHEREAS: The young person's artistic experiences encourage the exploration and personalization of the physical world, while instilling discipline which will serve the individual well in a variety of life's settings, and

- WHEREAS: The young artist learns to respect his own work and abilities and the products and talents of others as unique gifts to be appreciated; and
- WHEREAS: The development of any individual's artistic abilities, and all human potential, is a truly worthwhile pursuit which deserves the encouragement of all who value a healthy, diverse, productive society;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of March, 1980, to be

## YOUTH ART MONTH

in Minnesota, and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. I further urge all citizens to support our art educators and young people who dedicate themselves to the development of creative artistic expression.
