



## Proclamation

WHEREAS: INTERNATIONAL MUSEUM DAY IS A TIME TO OFFICIALLY RECOGNIZE THE MUSEUM AS A VEHICLE FOR INCREASING KNOWLEDGE, STIMULATING THOUGHTFUL INQUIRY AND ENHANCING CROSS-CULTURAL COMMUNICATION; AND

WHEREAS: MUSEUMS PLAY A SPECIAL ROLE IN PRESERVING OUR HERITAGE AND CREATING A SENSE OF CONTINUITY AND PRIDE, AND THUS ADD IMMEASURABLY TO THE QUALITY OF LIFE IN OUR STATE AND TO THE EDUCATION AND SENSITIVITY OF ALL MINNESOTANS;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM MAY 18, 1980 TO BE

### INTERNATIONAL MUSEUM DAY

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME; FURTHER, I URGE ALL MINNESOTANS TO SALUTE OUR MUSEUMS, THEIR DEDICATED STAFFS, AND THE INCREASE IN KNOWLEDGE THEY PROVIDE.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TWENTY-THIRD DAY OF APRIL IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY, AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-SECOND.
