

Proclamation

- WHEREAS: The Great State of Minnesota is prosperous and thriving today due to the contributions of horses; and
- WHEREAS: The breed of horses known as Morgan was directly responsible for civilizing this land; and
- WHEREAS: Our Calvary Remount Program would not have succeeded withour the Morgan influence; and
- WHEREAS: The horse industry to this day is a vital segment of the economy of this State; and
- WHEREAS: The Morgan is the only registered breed of horse ever perpetuated by the United States Government; and
- WHEREAS: The North Central Morgan Association will sponsor a week of Morgan activities climaxed by the three day North Star Morgan Show to be held in the Coliseum at The Minnesota State Fair Grounds, July 11, 12, and 13, 1980;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of July 7 through July 13, 1980 to be
