WHEREASL ROTC graduates from the State of Minnesota have served and are

leaders in other professional and community settings as well;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 3, 1980 to be

and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same. Further, I urge all citizens to be mindful of the service, dedication and purpose of ROTC in the life of our nation.
