HEREAS: THE United States Space Program has yielded many scientific and technological achievements that have enriched the lives of all human beings; and

HEREAS: THE United States Space Program has renewed and excited a sense of pioneering in the American people, giving us a feeling for the sense of adventure that motivated our ancestors' explorations, while providing the sense of achievement and ascendancy that comes from Bold success at a new frontier; and

HEREAS: THE United States Space Program has provided employment opportunities and long-term economic benefits to the people of the United States through the Aerospace and Spin-off Industries, our Institutions of Higher Education, and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration; and

THEREAS: July 20, 1980 is the 11th anniversary of the Apollo XI Lunar Landing, when two Americans became the first people of Earth to set foot on the moon;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, so hereby proclaim July 16 through 24, 1980 to be
