

Proclamation

WHEREAS: MINNESOTA IS FORTUNATE TO BE THE HOME OF A GREAT NUMBER OF OUTSTANDING ORGANIZATIONS DEDICATED TO THE PERFORMANCE, ENHANCEMENT AND ENCOURAGEMENT OF THE ARTS; AND

WHEREAS: IT IS BENEFICIAL FOR ALL CITIZENS TO BE OFFERED THE OPPORTUNITY TO ENJOY THE VARIETY OF ARTS ACTIVITIES IN OUR STATE; AND

WHEREAS: For the first time in the Twin Cities, approximately 25 top arts organizations will be experimenting with an outreach program in a metropolitan area shopping center, as a means to bring the arts to a wider cross-section of people; and

WHEREAS: These 25 cultural groups are eager to create excitement and enthusiasm in hopes of informing citizens of activities they may not have been aware of, and in which they may wish to participate in the future; and

WHEREAS: This program, running from August 11 through 24, 1980, includes performances and demonstrations of dance, acting, mime, singing, poetry, puppetry, crafts and film; and

WHEREAS: This "Arts Alive!" celebration is a unique joining together of Minnesota's arts community to present a program of entertainment for the purposes of informing, educating and delighting citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE PERIOD FROM AUGUST 11 THROUGH AUGUST 24, 1980 TO BE

ARTS ALIVE DAYS!

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I ENCOURAGE ALL CITIZENS TO TAKE PART IN THIS EXCITING EVENT AT ROSEDALE SHOPPING CENTER, IN ROSEVILLE, MINNESOTA.
