

Proclamation

WHEREAS: THE FOUNDATION OF OUR NATION'S ECONOMY IS THE ABILITY OF OUR CITIZENS TO BUY BACK THE FRUITS OF THEIR LABOR; AND

WHEREAS: The Union Labels, Shop Cards, Store Cards, and Service Buttons of the organizations of American Labor are symbols of Good working conditions, fair wages, and increased security brought to workers through the achievement of the trade union movement and the process of collective bargaining; and

WHEREAS: The American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations, and its national Union Label and Service Trades Department have designated the period from Setpember 1 through September 6, 1980 as Union Label Week;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH 6, 1980 TO BE

UNION LABEL WEEK

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I URGE ALL CITIZENS TO OBSERVE THIS WEEK AS A TRIBUTE TO THE MEN AND WOMEN OF ORGANIZED LABOR.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, We have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed this fifteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty, and of the State the one hundred twenty second.
