

Proclamation

WHEREAS: It is fitting and proper that time be set aside in the State OF MINNESOTA TO RECOGNIZE THE CONTRIBUTIONS MADE TO OUR NATION BY PERSONS OF HISPANIC DESCENT; AND

WHEREAS: THE NEED IS RECOGNIZED TO UNITE THE VARIOUS CULTURES OF OUR STATE BY GIVING THEM DUE RECOGNITION, AND THEREBY STRENGTHENING OUR HERITAGES, AND AS A RESULT MOVE FORWARD TOGETHER; AND

WHEREAS: THROUGH EFFORTS IN THE POLITICAL AND LEGISLATIVE PROCESSES, MINNESOTA'S HISPANIC COMMUNITY HAS DEMONSTRATED THEIR COMMITMENT TO BEING FULL PARTICIPANTS IN THIS STATE'S DEMOCRATIC PROCESS; AND

OUR HISPANIC POPULATION HAS CONTRIBUTED TO THE RICHNESS OF WHEREAS: MINNESOTA, AND HAS STRENGTHENED OUR AGRICULTURAL AND INDUSTRIAL ECONOMIES;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF SEPTEMBER 14 THROUGH 20, 1980 TO BE

HISPANIC HERITAGE WEEK

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TENTH DAY OF SEPTEMBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
