



Proclamation

WHEREAS: PRODUCTIVITY HAS BEEN A HALLMARK OF AMERICAN ENTERPRISE, AND, IF SUFFICIENTLY PURSUED, CAN ONCE AGAIN AID OUR NATION'S SOUND DEVELOPMENT; AND

WHEREAS: THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF INDUSTRIAL ENGINEERS AND ITS TWIN CITY CHAPTER, AS PROFESSIONAL PRACTITIONERS IN PRODUCTIVITY IMPROVEMENT, ARE EMPHASIZING THE VITAL NEED TO MEET THE PRODUCTIVITY CHALLENGE FACING THIS NATION; AND

WHEREAS: THE CITIZENS OF MINNESOTA ARE EQUAL PARTNERS IN THE NATIONAL FORCE NEEDED TO REVERSE THE DOWNWARD TREND IN PRODUCTIVITY;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF OCTOBER 1980 TO BE

PRODUCTIVITY MONTH

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I URGE ALL CITIZENS TO SEEK WAYS TO IMPROVE INDIVIDUAL AND COLLECTIVE PRODUCTIVITY IN BUSINESS, INDUSTRY AND GOVERNMENT.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TENTH DAY OF SEPTEMBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
