

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Public concern about public education should be not only uppermost, BUT ALSO SHOULD EXTEND INTO THE FUTURE; AND

WHEREAS: ASIDE FROM HUMAN CONSIDERATIONS, THE MAINTENANCE OF OUR HIGH LEVEL OF EDUCATION IN MINNESOTA IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY; AND

WHEREAS: PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT IN THE AFFAIRS AND PLANNING OF SCHOOLS IS WANTED - AND NEEDED - BY EDUCATORS; AND

WHEREAS: Now is the time for educators and community to join in preparing FOR THE CONTINUING SUCCESS OF PUBLIC EDUCATION FOR ALL TIME; AND

WHEREAS: These concerns are reflected in the 1980 national theme - Education FOR THE '80s...PREPARATION FOR THE FUTURE - A THEME THAT SUITS OUR STATE;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF NOVEMBER 16 THROUGH 22, 1980 TO BE

AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I URGE ALL CITIZENS TO REAFFIRM THEIR COMMITMENT TO IMPROVING EDUCATION ON ALL LEVELS. AND TO TRANSLATE THAT COMMITMENT INTO ACTION BY VISITING LOCAL SCHOOLS.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS FIFTEENTH DAY OF OCTOBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY. AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
