

Proclamation

WHEREAS: IT HAS BECOME COMMON KNOWLEDGE THAT CIGARETTE SMOKING IS DAMAGING TO HEALTH AND IS RELATED TO THE DEATHS OF APPROXIMATELY 5,000 MINNESOTANS EACH YEAR; AND

WHEREAS: Surveys have shown that a Large percentage of smokers are anxious to give up the habit; and

WHEREAS: During that past seven years, thousands of smokers have participated in Minnesota D-Day, a day on which they give up cigarettes for just 24 hours; and

WHEREAS: A SUBSTANTIAL NUMBER OF THOSE WHO GAVE UP CIGARETTES FOR THE DAY WERE ABLE TO GIVE UP THE HABIT ENTIRELY; AND

WHEREAS: This demonstration of success suggests that D-Day has potential for improving the health of people in our State;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 20, 1980 TO BE

KICK OFF OF D-DAY

IN MINNESOTA, AND IN SO DOING URGE ALL CIGAREETTE SMOKERS TO PLEDGE TO QUIT SMOKING ON JANUARY 22, 1981, WHICH IS

MINNESOTA D-DAY

IN WITNESS WHEREOF. WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS SEVENTH DAY OF NOVEMBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY, AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
