

Proclamation

WHEREAS: MINNESOTA IS A HIGHLY DEVELOPED STATE PIONEERED BY ITS HARDY FOREFATHERS, AND EACH GENERATION IN TURN HAS MADE SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS TO AID THE FOLLOWING GENERATION; AND

WHEREAS: MINNESOTA HAS MADE GREAT PROGRESS IN THE FIELDS OF MEDICINE, ENGINEERING, AND OTHER FIELDS WITH A VIEW TOWARD THE BETTERMENT OF MANKIND; AND

WHEREAS: MINNESOTA PROUDLY RECOGNIZES THAT EACH NATION AND ETHNIC GROUP HAS MADE GREAT PROGRESS AND SHARED THIS PROGRESS WITH ALL MANKIND;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM OCTOBER 24, 1980 TO BE

DIGNITY OF MANKIND DAY

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS 'PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I URGE ALL CITIZENS TO BE SUPPORTIVE OF THEIR FELLOWMAN AND SENSITIVE TO THEIR NEEDS.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF. WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS FOURTEENTH DAY OF NOVEMBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY, AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
