

Proclamation

WHEREAS: DEVEMBER 7, 1980 MARKS THE 39TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE INVASION

OF PEARL HARBOR; AND

WHEREAS: December 7 recalls a day that Americans will never forget, and whose significance must be taught to our youth; and

WHEREAS: THE PEARL HARBOR SURVIVORS STAND AS A LIVING TESTIMONY OF OUR CONTINUING OBLIGATION TO BE PREPARED TO DEFEND OURSELVES:

NOW, THEREFORE, I. ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM DECEMBER 7, 1980 TO BE

PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I URGE ATTENTION TO THE PROPER COMMEMORATION OF THIS EVENT IN AMERICAN HISTORY WITH DUE HONOR TO THE DEFENSE OF PEARL HARBOR.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS FOURTEENTH DAY OF NOVEMBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY, AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
