Sec. 2.02. <u>Terms</u>. The Mayor and each Council person shall hold office for a term of two years commencing on the first business day of January of the year following their election, and until a successor is elected and qualifies.

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2.02.1. The term of office for the Mayor and each Council person elected at the 1982 spring election shall expire on the first business day of January, 1984.

Sec. 2.05. Filling Vacancies.

A. Interim Appointee. The Council may within thirty (30) days of a Council vacancy elect a qualified voter of the city to fill the vacancy as an interim appointee until such time as a successor is elected as set forth below or for the remainder of the unexpired term if the Council vacancy occurs after the last day for the filing of affidavits of candidacy for United States Representative. If a tie vote occurs in the filling of a vacancy in the office of Councilman, the Mayor shall break the tie.

In the event that the Council does not fill the vacancy within 30 days, the Mayor shall within 10 days thereafter appoint a qualified voter of the city to fill the vacancy as an interim appointee until such time as a successor is elected as set forth below or for the remainder of the unexpired term if the vacancy occurs after the last day for the filing of affidavits of candidacy for United States Representative.

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If a vacancy occurs in the office of Mayor, the Council shall within 30 days elect a qualified voter of the city to fill the vacancy as an interim appointee until such time as a successor is elected as set forth below or for the remainder of the unexpired term if the vacancy occurs after the last day for the filing of affidavits of candidacy for United States Representative.

B. Elected Successor. If the vacancy occurs on or before the last day for the filing of affidavits of candidacy to be a United States Representative, the vacancy shall be filled at the next state-wide general election, being the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of even-numbered years.

Affidavits of candidacy for said vacancy shall be filed with the City Clerk within 14 days of the last day for the filing of affidavits of candidacy for United States Representative. In the event that more than two persons file for the vacancy, a primary election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in September of said even-numbered year.

Sec. 7.01. City Elections. The election of city officers and such other officers as are required by law to be elected at a city election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in odd numbered years.

Sec. 7.05. Primary Elections. A primary election shall be held on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in September. preceding any municipal election day.

Effective Date: Section 2.02.1 and Section 2.05 shall be effective upon passage.

Section 2.02, Section 7.01 and Section 7.05 shall be effective January 1, 1983.

These amendments shall not take effect unless during the 1981 session the Minnesota State Legislature enacts a similar provision governing the election of board members of Independent School District No. 625.
