

All weighing and sampling fees include the services of one State sampler/weighing during regular hours. Overtime charges will be billed separately. Instances necessitating additional personnel will be billed at the appropriate hourly time rate.

700 OTHER:


Whenever a service is requested and cannot be performed through no fault of the Department, the regular or overtime rate shall be applied. When services of the Department are requested or required, including check testing of mechanical samplers, or which require the Department employee to incur additional expenses such as mileage, meals, lodging, etc., such additional costs shall be charged also, in addition to all inspection fees and time charges set forth in Sections I and II.

703 Meals - If an employee is required to work more than ten (10) and/or sixteen (16) consecutive hours on a continuous grain loading or unloading operation that remains in progress and such operation does not allow the employees to leave their assigned work station for a normal meal break, the Employer will furnish such employees with a catered meal after ten (10) consecutive work hours and a catered lunch after sixteen (16) consecutive work hours. The cost of such meals will be billed back to the loading or unloading facility. The foregoing provision shall apply only when the Department is required to work overtime.

#### ORDER FOR ADJUSTMENT OF FEES

Pursuant to the authority vested in me under Minnesota Statutes, Section 16A.128 and 27.07, I hereby find the need for increasing fees and hereby order that the following fees be set for inspecting and grading produce subject to sale where a certificate of inspection showing the grade, quality, and conditions of the produce is issued. These fees shall be effective on or after January 1, 1981. These fees are payable by the parties requesting inspection service to the Commissioner of Agriculture pursuant to law.

#### SCHEDULE OF FEES

##### LOT INSPECTIONS (NON-CONTRACT):

<u>Type</u>	<u>Fee</u>
Potatoes	6 cents per hundredweight, plus \$1.00 for each additional lot.
Apples	8 cents per hundredweight, plus \$1.00 for each additional lot.
Other Products (onions, carrots, etc.)	7 cents per hundredweight, plus \$1.00 for each additional lot.
Mileage	A mileage fee of 19 cents a mile is charged whenever the inspection point is 20 miles or more from the nearest available inspector.
Overtime	Overtime charges at the rate of \$6.50 per hour are applicable for any inspections required before 8:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M. Monday thru Friday, and for all hours on Saturday, Sunday, and state holidays.
Standby Charge	\$6.50 per hour if product is not available for inspection at the time requested.
Miscellaneous	Inspection telegrams will be provided at \$15.00 each. Extra certificate copies will be provided at \$2.25 each.
Minimum Fee	The minimum fee for inspection is \$10.00.



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
