

## Proclamation

WHEREAS: THE CONCEPT OF FREEDOM HAS BEEN UPPERMOST IN THE MINDS OF MINNESOTANS SINCE THE DAY THE IRANIANS TOOK AMERICANS HOSTAGE; AND

WHEREAS: THE CONCEPT OF FREEDOM ENLARGES TO OTHER AREAS OF LIVING, SUCH AS SLAVERY TO HABITS OF ALCOHOL, OTHER DRUGS AND TOBACCO; AND

WHEREAS: In contrast to helplessness of average citizens in solving the first hostage problem, citizens CAN help to free themselves and others from the second type of slavery, through legislation, education and determination; and

WHEREAS: The matter of abstinence from beverage alcohol, other narcotics, and tobacco, demands serious attention by parents, teachers, and others whose activities bring them in contact with youth;
