WHEREAS: Through purposeful activities, these therapists and their assistants HELP TO BRING ABOUT A HIGHER QUALITY OF LIFE FOR OUR CHILDREN AND SENIOR CITIZENS, FOR OUR PHYSICALLY, SOCIALLY AND MENTALLY HANDICAPPED, AND FOR BURN VICTIMS, STROKE PATIENTS, AMPUTEES AND OTHERS WHOSE CAPACITY TO FUNCTION IN A NORMAL MANNER IS IN SOME WAY IMPAIRED; AND

WHEREAS: Occupational Therapists work in our schools, rehabilitative centers, HOSPITALS, HOMES, AND IN OUR CLINICS, HELPING TO MEET THE PHYSICAL, PSYCHOLOGICAL, AND REHABILITATIVE GOALS WHICH CAN BE REALISTICALLY SET FOR INDIVIDUALS IN NEED OF THEIR SERVICES;
