REORGANIZATION ORDER NO. 114

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1980, Section 16.125 the following administrative reorganization is made with prior approval of the Governor.

In order to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of community development services, the duties of the Office of Local and Urban Affairs and the State Planning Agency set forth in Minnesota Statutes § 4.26, 4.27, 4.28, 4.29, 4.30, 4.36, 273.74 Subd. 5, 462.39 Subd. 3, 462.391 Subd. 4, 462.395, 462.396, 462.398, 462.711 (1980) and Laws 1979, Chapter 333, Section 31, Subd. 3, paragraphs j, k, l are transferred by this reorganization order to the Department of Economic Development. This order shall not be deemed to limit the authority of the Governor to delegate other powers, duties and responsibilities of the State Planning Officer to any state officer or department by executive order and consistent with Minnesota Statutes § 4.11, Subd. 6 (1980).

The legally authorized complement of the State Planning Agency necessary to perform these duties and the incumbents at their current salary rate with all earned sick leave and annual leave, are transferred to the Minnesota Department of Economic Development. Attachment A reflects the programs, activities, position numbers, and names of staff to be transferred.

The FY 1981 complement of the Minnesota State Planning Agency is decreased by 29 legislative complement positions, 2 revolving positions and 1 LAC authorized position. The FY 1981 complement of the Minnesota Department of Economic Development is increased by 29 legislative complement positions, 2 revolving positions and 1 LAC authorized position.

The Commissioner of Finance shall make the necessary financial determinations in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 1978, Section 16.125, Subd. 3.

Transfer of equipment, furnishings and supplies, and existing space lease will be made as agreed by the involved agencies. Copies of the lists of equipment, furnishings, and supplies are on file in the Department of Administration.


Any grant agreement or other contractual agreement that is outstanding shall be amended to reflect the change in responsible state agency.

The effective date of this order is March 1, 1981. The order is herewith filed with the Secretary of State and shall remain in effect until amended or superseded by proper authority.



EXECUTIVE ORDER 81-2

Restricting State Hiring,
Procurement and Expenditures

I, ALBERT H. QUIE, Governor of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

WHEREAS, the national and state economies have not yet recovered from the recent recession and revenues realized to date are less than previously estimated; and

WHEREAS, prudent management requires that timely measures be taken to provide for the possibility that revenues realized for the balance of the current fiscal year will be less than anticipated; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of this administration that the State of Minnesota conclude the current fiscal year with a balanced budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Order:

1. No appointing authority in the Executive Branch of State government shall employ any person to fill a vacant position (classified or


unclassified) which is paid from the General Fund during the pendency of this order except as provided in paragraph 2.


2. This prohibition on hiring shall not extend to positions to be filled by persons who:
 - a. Will be providing direct care to patients at State institutions;
 - b. Will be providing direct supervision of inmates at correctional facilities;
 - c. Will be performing services necessary to the maintenance of public safety or otherwise essential to the operation of State government as determined by the Commissioner of Finance;
 - d. Will provide direct instructional services to students in the State's post-secondary institutions;
 - e. Are on leave from a State position and elect to continue employment with the State;
 - f. Will perform services as inmate, resident or student employees of State institutions; or
 - g. Have received confirmation of appointment to State positions previous to the effective date of this Order.
3. No person in the Executive Branch shall execute on behalf of any State agency during the pendency of this Order a contract for the performance of consultant services as defined by M.S. 16.098 and to be paid from the General Fund unless the Commissioner of Administration determines that the services to be performed are essential to the maintenance of public safety or are otherwise essential to the operation of State government.

4. No procurement transactions shall be processed on behalf of any agency of State government against the General Fund unless the Commissioner of Administration determines that the goods or services to be purchased are essential to the operation of State government.
5. No person in the Executive Branch shall engage in out-of-state travel to be paid from the General Fund unless the Commissioner of Finance determines that such travel is essential to the operation of State government.
6. None of the foregoing provisions shall be interpreted to invalidate any legal or contracted obligations of the State.
7. All Commissioners and Department Heads shall take steps to limit such expenditures as are not otherwise limited by the above provisions. Each Department Head shall review and certify any request for exemption from the provisions of this Order before such request is submitted to the Commissioner of Administration or Finance.
8. Because of the need to take immediate action, this Order shall be effective at 12:01 p.m. March 2, 1981.

Please take notice that on the 17th of February, 1981 at a regularly scheduled meeting the Metropolitan Airports Commission adopted Ordinance Number 55

An ordinance to promote and conserve the public safety, health, peace, convenience and welfare, to provide regulation on use of the Minneapolis-Saint Paul International - Wold-Chamberlain Field and to control the loading and unloading of passengers and freight thereat by transient and general aviation aircraft, but not including scheduled air carrier and military aircraft; to provide for payment of use fees by aircraft other than scheduled air carrier and military aircraft; to provide for payment of ramp charges, lobby fees and international incinerator fees at the transient service facilities; prescribing the penalty for violation thereof; and to repeal Commission Ordinances No. 40, 48, 49 and 54.

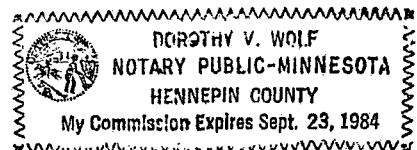

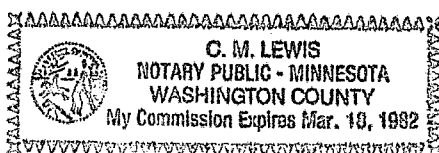

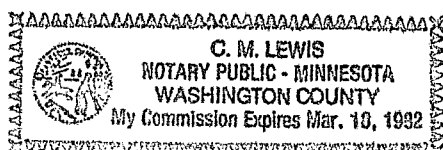
