Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting was duly held at the City Hall, 7516 80th Street South, on the 4th day of March, 1981 at 7:30 o'clock P.M.

The following members were present: Mayor Peterson  
Councilwoman Berndt  
Councilman Denzer  
Councilman Hammero

And the following were absent: Councilman Amundson (excused)

Mayor Peterson presided.

The minutes of the February 18, 1981 regular meeting were reviewed. There being no additions or corrections, they were approved as mailed.

Councilwoman Berndt introduced the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 81-18

RESOLUTION APPROVING CONSENT ITEMS ON CITY COUNCIL AGENDA OF  
MARCH 4, 1981

BE IT RESOLVED, that Ordinance No. 349, An Ordinance for the City of Cottage Grove, Minnesota Amending Ordinance No. 348, By Changing the Code Section Number; and license applications from Allen S. Kiemele, Solicitor; Edward C. Bramlege, Solicitor; John S. Grant, Solicitor; Nielson Carpentry, General Contractor; J. Thury & Sons, General Contractor; Twin City Storm Sash Company, Inc., Siding Contractor; Cub Foods, Inc., Cigarette; and Cub Foods, Inc., Off Sale Non-Intoxicating Malt Liquor License be approved.

Passed this 4th day of March, 1981.

The motion for the adoption of the foregoing resolution was duly seconded by Councilman Hammero. Upon vote being taken thereon, the following voted in favor thereof: Councilwoman Berndt, Councilman Hammero, Councilman Denzer, and Mayor Peterson. The following voted against the same: None. Whereupon said resolution was duly declared passed and adopted.

Representative Sieben and Senator Sikorski were not in attendance because they failed to get notices of the meeting out to the public.

Notice regarding the organization of the Sewer Service Advisory Board was read. Administrator is to attend.

The Mayor directed that the Attorney and staff prepare an ordinance relating to Cultural Resources Management and Historic Preservation, and that this ordinance be referred to the appropriate Commissions for their review.

The Attorney advised the Council as to the negotiations with the Cottage Grove Police Association and that it is not settled at this point.

The Mayor directed that this matter be brought up later in the meeting.

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Motion that Mr. Michael Halpern be promoted to the position of Captain in the City's Police Department, said promotion to be effective March 1, 1981, at the salary as set forth by resolution on a six (6) months probationary period and subject to the satisfactory completion of a psychological examination, made by Councilwoman Berndt. Seconded by Councilman Hammero. Carried viva voce.

The Mayor deferred any discussion on the Management Study and the 1982 Budget Projection Levy Limit until Councilman Amundson could be in attendance.

Discussion was held regarding the 1979 audit and management letter. No action taken.

Motion that the audit of the City's funds for 1980 be done by the State Auditor's Office, made by Councilwoman Berndt. Motion failed for lack of second.

Motion that the Council accept the quote of Bailey Nurseries to provide trees to the City at a cost of \$5,726.15, made by Councilman Denzer. Seconded by Councilwoman Berndt. Carried viva voce.

Motion that the Council accept the Labor Agreement between the International Union of Operating Engineers, Local 49 representing the City's Public Works employees for the years January 1, 1981 through December 31, 1982, and that the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to sign said agreement, made by Councilman Denzer. Seconded by Councilman Hammero. Carried viva voce.

Motion that the Council approve the purchase of one (1) ATEC "Casey" pitching machine in the amount of \$1,575.00, and two (2) soccer training films at a cost of \$360.00 and that said cost is to be taken from the Athletic Association's 1981 budget, made by Councilwoman Berndt. Seconded by Councilman Denzer. Carried viva voce.

Motion that the Council approve the establishing of an additional two Light Equipment Operator positions in the Street Department and that staff is authorized to advertise for these positions, made by Councilwoman Berndt. Seconded by Councilman Denzer. Carried viva voce.

Motion that the Council accept the 1980 Parks and Recreation Department Annual Report and ordered it placed on file in the office of the City Clerk, made by Councilwoman Berndt. Seconded by Councilman Denzer. Carried viva voce.

Motion that the Council accept the resignation of Eugene Hanson from the Human Services Commission and that a letter and Certificate of Appreciation be sent to him, made by Councilman Denzer. Seconded by Councilman Hammero. Carried viva voce.

Motion that Dulce A. de Leon be appointed to the Human Services Commission for a term to expire January 1, 1984, made by Councilman Denzer. Seconded by Councilwoman Berndt. Carried viva voce.

Motion that Ernest Sergeant, Jr. be appointed as Chairman of the Human Services Commission for 1981, made by Councilman Denzer. Seconded by Councilman Hammero. Carried viva voce.

Notice of the 1981 League Legislative Action Conference was read. No action taken.

Motion that the Council approve the installation of insulation on the outside walls of the upper level of City Hall and award the contract to do said work to

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Mr. Vern Moen in the amount of \$2,778.00 and that said monies be appropriated from the General Fund Balance, made by Councilwoman Berndt. Seconded by Councilman Hammero. Carried viva voce.

Motion that the Council approve the temporary opening of Grey Cloud Island Park as a canoe launching area to be used in conjunction with the annual Pedal-Pace-Paddle Race sponsored by the Community Education and DECA Clubs and that the Parks, Recreation and Natural Resources Commission study the possibility of opening the park for a longer period, made by Councilman Denzer. Seconded by Councilwoman Berndt. Carried viva voce.

Motion that the Council approve the lease agreement between the City and Independent School District 833 for the use of school property as recreational areas and that the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to sign said agreement, made by Councilwoman Berndt. Seconded by Councilman Denzer. Carried viva voce.

The Council acknowledged the Summons and Complaint regarding the suit of Lenore W. Kirkland and William B. Kirkland, Plaintiffs, vs. Donald G. Anderson, Brian K. Anderson, City of Cottage Grove and John Mickleson, Defendants.

Motion that the City direct its insurance company to defend not only the City of Cottage Grove, but also Patrolman John Mickleson in the above mentioned suit, made by Councilman Hammero. Seconded by Councilman Denzer. Carried viva voce.

Motion that the bills as presented be allowed, made by Councilwoman Berndt. Seconded by Councilman Denzer. Carried viva voce.

Motion that Bob Newby be reappointed to the Economic Development Commission for another three year term, made by Councilwoman Berndt. Seconded by Councilman Hammero. Carried viva voce.

The Council discussed the lawsuit between the Cottage Grove Police Association and the City regarding salary payments.

Council was advised that the Association would accept \$2,800.00 in attorney's fees with the guarantee that all Police Association members would receive 26 equal pay checks. Since there was still some disagreement, the Mayor requested that staff furnish the Council with any additional information that they have and that it be referred to the next regular Council meeting.

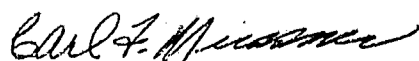
The Council reviewed the quotes received regarding the Public Officials Liability Insurance. No action taken.

FEES AND CHARGES ORDER NO. 24  
AMENDING FEES AND CHARGES ORDER NO. 23

Effective March 27, 1981

Pursuant to authority vested in me by law, I, Joseph Alexander, Commissioner of Natural Resources, do hereby establish the following fees and charges for State Park and State Forest Facilities and republish herein the Fort Snelling Chapel Rental Fee schedule established by the Commissioner of Administration pursuant to Laws of Minnesota 1974, Chapter 355, Section 44, effective July 31, 1974. All previous orders establishing fees and charges are hereby rescinded and superceded by this order.

TOURIST CAMPS

Semi Modern	\$5.00/campsite/night
Rustic*	\$4.00/campsite/night

Semi-modern campsites rates will reduce to those charges for rustic campsites during winter months. The date that rate changes take effect will vary among parks and will depend on when the reduction or increase in services take effect at an individual park.

Electricity where available is \$1.00/day in addition to camping fee - whether used or not.

BACKPACKING - CANOE

1) Family	\$3.00/campsite/night
2) Group (a) 6 or less	\$3.00/campsite/night
(b) more than 6	\$3.00 + 50¢/person over 6 per campsite per night

CANOES AND ROW BOATS

\$2.00 first hour  
1.00 each additional hour  
8.00 maximum daily charge  
Deposit Required

Exception: In state parks where private concessions operate, rates are subject to annual negotiations.

Seasonal Boat Launching and Dockage Permit - \$15.00 per boat.

ORGANIZED YOUTH GROUP CAMPS

CLASS I GROUP CAMPS

Long Term -(14 days or more)

\$30.00 per day for the pre-camp and post-camp periods. Such period shall not exceed 4 days pre-camp and 4 days post-camp.

1.00 per person per day during camping period or minimum daily charge based on rated capacity of the individual camp.

Short Term - (less than 14 days)

\$ 1.50 per camper per day for the minimum rated capacity for camps and the minimum rental period shall be two nights.

\*Fees apply to rustic campsites only.

ORGANIZED YOUTH GROUP CAMPS - CON'T.

CLASS II GROUP CAMPS

\$20.00 per day for the pre-camp and post-camp periods. Such period shall not exceed 2 days pre-camp and 2 days post-camp.

\$30.00 minimum group camp charge plus \$1.00 per camper per night for groups 31 or more.

CLASS III GROUP CAMPS

Youth Groups

\$ 5.00 minimum charge per group per night.

.75 per camper per night (staff included) for 7 or more campers.

Adult Groups

\$20.00 minimum charge per group per night.

.75 per camper per night for 27 or more campers.

Forfeiture Clause

Permittees of Class I or Class II group camps forfeit 25% of their estimated rental fee if reservations are cancelled within 10 days prior to occupancy.

Day Use of Group Camp Buildings (10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.)

Certain buildings of group camps are available to the Permittee by special arrangements at a charge of \$30.00 per day.

ITASCA STATE PARK

Minimum rates per accommodation are quoted below. Each additional adult will be charged at the rate of \$4.00 per day and each child under 12 years of age at the rate of \$2.00 per day. Extra cots are not available. Cribs are available. All accommodations, unless otherwise stated, have private bath.
