

Proclamation

WHEREAS: MINNESOTANS HAVE ENDURED AN INDECISIVE WINTER, WITH A SNOWLESS LANDSCAPE CONFRONTING THEM DAILY; AND

- K-EREAS: THE PEOPLE OF OUR STATE SHARE A DEEP LOVE FOR THE LAND AND AN APPRECIATION FOR THE TREMENDOUS PHYSICAL AND EMOTIONAL BENEFITS FROM WORKING WITH THE SOIL AND ENJOYING ITS FRUITS; AND
- WHEREAS: As we approach the spring season, Minnesotans are anxious to dig into the soil, plant their gardens and enjoy the warm sunshine and fresh air; and
- WHEREAS: RIDGEDALE CENTER, IN MINNETONKA, MINNESOTA, HAS CREATED "RIDGEDALE COMMUNITY PARK" FOR THE BENEFIT OF MINNESOTANS WHO ARE EAGER TO BEGIN THEIR CELEBRATION OF SPRING;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM MARCH 14, 1981 TO BE

THE FIRST DAY OF SPRING

AT RIDGEDALE CENTER

and have asked Lieutenant Governor Lou Wangberg to prepare this proclamation for my signature and disseminate the same.
