

Proclamation

WHEREAS: THE ECONOMIC WELL-BEING OF MINNESOTA AND THE ENTIRE NATION DEPENDS UPON THE EXISTANCE OF A VIABLE TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM; AND

WHEREAS: From the early days of steamboats and Red River oxcarts, to the present day with its extensive and diverse transportation network, Minnesota has always been well-served by many forms of conveyance; and

WHEREAS: MINNESOTA'S HIGHWAYS MAKE THIS STATE AN IMPORTANT CENTER FOR THE TRUCKING INDUSTRY IN THE UNITED STATES, AND OUR RAILROAD TRACKAGE IS LARGE AND WELL-PLACED; AND

WHEREAS: Barge navigation on our rivers, as well as ocean vessels reaching Minnesota ports via the Saint Lawrance Seaway provide our state waterbourne access to much of this continent and the world, and our well-developed airport system provides a means of travel and shipping to both foreign and domestic places; and

WHEREAS: Congressional action in 1962 formalized the observance of National Transportation Week;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF MAY 10 THROUGH 16, 1981 TO BE

TRANSPORTATION WEEK

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I URGE ALL CITIZENS TO REFLECT UPON THE CONTRIBUTIONS OUR EXCELLENT TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM MAKES TO THE QUALITY OF LIFE IN OUR STATE.
