



# Proclamation

WHEREAS: ALL AMERICANS SHARE TREMENDOUS ANXIETY AND FRUSTRATION OVER THE RECENT DISAPPEARANCES OF NUMEROUS BLACK YOUTH IN ATLANTA, GEORGIA; AND

WHEREAS: THE PEOPLE OF MINNESOTA ARE CONCERNED FOR THE SAFETY OF ALL ATLANTA CHILDREN AND ENCOURAGE THE EFFORTS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS TO INVESTIGATE THESE DISAPPEARANCES AND PREVENT THEIR CONTINUATION; AND

WHEREAS: THE SECURITY OF ALL SOCIETY IS THREATENED AS THESE INNOCENT YOUNG PEOPLE ARE TERRORIZED; AND

WHEREAS: ON MARCH 29, 1981, THE MINNESOTA BUSINESS LEAGUE WILL BE SPONSORING A BENEFIT EVENT TO ASSIST IN THE INVESTIGATIONS IN ATLANTA;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM MARCH 29, 1981 TO BE A

## DAY OF COMMEMORATION FOR THE DISAPPEARANCE OF ATLANTA YOUTH

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I URGE ALL CITIZENS TO SUPPORT THE EFFORTS OF THE MINNESOTA BUSINESS LEAGUE TO END THESE TRAGIC OCCURANCES.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TWENTY-SIXTH DAY OF MARCH IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE, AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
