

Proclamation

HEREAS: THE CHILDREN OF MINNESOTA CONSTITUTE OUR MOST PRECIOUS RESOURCE; AND

WHEREAS: THE CRITICAL SIGNIFICANCE OF THE CARE AND EXPERIENCES OF CHILDREN FROM INFANCY THROUGH THEIR EARLY SCHOOL YEARS IS INCREASINGLY RECOGNIZED; AND

WHEREAS: By BIRTH, EVERY CHILD IS ENTITLED TO RESPECT FOR HIMSELF "AS AND FOR WHAT HE IS"; LOVE, SECURITY AND ENCOURAGEMENT FROM A STABLE HOME; HEALTH AND NUTRITION TO INSURE HIS OPTIMAL PHYSICAL AND MENTAL DEVELOPMENT; PROTECTION FROM PHYSICAL DANGERS AND MORAL HAZARDS BY A COMMUNITY WHICH PLANS FOR ITS CHILDREN'S NEEDS; PROGRAMS WHICH STIMULATE AND FACILITATE CHILDREN'S FULLEST INTELLECTUAL DEVELOPMENT - BUILDING UPON CHILDREN'S INTEREST TO EXPERIMENT AND DISCOVER THINGS ABOUT THEMSELVES, OTHER PEOPLE AND THE EVER BROADENING WORLD IN WHICH THEY LIVE; CONCERN, STIMULATION AND GUIDANCE FROM THE ADULTS IN THEIR LIVES;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H, QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF APRIL 5 THROUGH 11, 1981 TO BE

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed this twenty-sixth day of MARCH IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE, AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
