

Proclamation

WHEREAS: In 1866, Congress authorized use of the metric system of measurement in the United States; and

WHEREAS: The Metric Conversion Act of 1975 establishes a national policy of coordinating and planning the increasing voluntary use of the metric system in the United States; and

WHEREAS: The United States Metric Board, in cooperation with the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics, and other national organizations, supports the designation of May 10-16, 1981 as "National Metric Week; and

WHEREAS: THE STATE OF MINNESOTA RECOGNIZES THE NEED TO ASSIST ITS CITIZENS THROUGH INFORMATION AND EDUCATION PROGRAM TO BECOME FAMILIAR WITH THE MEANING OF METRIC TERMS AND MEASURES IN THEIR DAILY LIVES;

NOW, THEREFORE, I. ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF MAY 10 THROUGH 16, 1981 TO BE

METRIC WEEK

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I ENCOURAGE CITIZENS TO PARTICIPATE IN METRIC AWARENESS AND EDUCATION ACTIVITIES.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, We have hereunto set our hands and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed this twenty-sixth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty-one, and of the State the one hundred twenty-second.
