

Proclamation

WHEREAS: MINNESOTA'S OLDER ADULTS ARE A VALUABLE RESOURCE OF EXPERIENCE, wisdom, and tested ability, deserving of respect and admiration for the love, patience, hope and guidance they have shown their families, friends and neighbors throughout their lives; and

WHEREAS: THE STRIVINGS OF MINNESOTA'S OLDER ADULTS TO DEVELOP OUR STATE'S RESOURCES WHILE MAINTAINING ITS NATURAL BEAUTY HAVE RESULTED IN AN ENVIRONMENT THAT IS THE ENVY OF THE NATION; AND

WHEREAS: OUR OLDER CITIZENS CONTINUE TO OFFER WISDOM THROUGH THEIR EXAMPLE OF HOW MANKIND MAY GROW AND DEEPEN IN THE LATER YEARS; AND

WHEREAS: THE MINNESOTA WHITE HOUSE CONFERENCE ON AGING WILL BE HELD May 27 and 28 to prepare recommendations for the national conference which will be held next November and December;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF MAY 1981 TO BE

OLDER AMERICANS MONTH

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I URGE CITIZENS TO SHOW SUPPORT FOR OLDER AMERICANS THROUGHOUT THE MONTH OF MAY AND ALL DAYS OF THE YEAR. FURTHERMORE, I ENCOURAGE MINNESOTANS TO ATTEND THE MINNESOTA WHITE HOUSE CONFERENCE ON AGING TO BECOME BETTER AWARE OF ISSUES AFFECTING THE LIVES OF THESE IMPORTANT CITIZENS.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA DO BE AFFIXED THIS NINTH DAY OF APRIL IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.

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
