WHEREAS: MINNESOTA HAS BEEN ACCLAIMED BY SOCIAL, ECONOMIC AND URBAN AUTHORITIES AS A LEADER IN QUALITY OF LIFE, AND IS RECOGNIZED AS A FORERUNNER IN THE FIELD OF ENERGY-CONSCIOUS DESIGN AND RESEARCH; AND

WHEREAS: THE TWIN CITIES HAS BEEN CHOSEN AS THE SITE OF THE 1981 AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS' NATIONAL CONVENTION, WHICH WILL BE HELD DURING THE WEEK OF MAY 17 THROUGH 21; AND
