

Proclamation

COMMUNICATION IS A DOMINANT INFLUENCE IN THE LIFE OF EVERY WHEREAS: INDIVIDUAL: AND

WHEREAS: HEARING, SPEECH AND LANGUAGE DISORDERS CONSTITUTE OUR NATION'S NUMBER ONE HANDICAPPING DISABILITY, AFFECTING AN ESTIMATED 420,000 PEOPLE IN MINNESOTA ALONE, AND 22 MILLION AMERICANS NATIONALLY; AND

MORE THAN TEN PERCENT OF ALL AMERICANS HAVE SPEECH, LANGUAGE WHEREAS: AND HEARING IMPAIRMENTS SO SEVERE THAT THEIR EDUCATIONAL, VOCATIONAL, PERSONAL, AND SOCIAL FUNCTIONS ARE ADVERSELY AFFECTED; AND

WHEREAS: MOST PEOPLE WITH COMMUNICATIVE IMPAIRMENTS COULD BE HELPED MEDICALLY, SURGICALLY, THROUGH APPLIFICATION OR REHABILITATION, BUT FIRST MUST KNOW THAT SUCH HELP IS AVAILABLE; AND

WHEREAS: Better Hearing and Speech Month is an intensive annual effort SPONSORED BY HEARING AND SPEECH ORGANIZATIONS AND OTHER CIVIC GROUPS TO INFORM PEOPLE ABOUT COMMUNICATIVE DISORDERS AND TO ENCOURAGE THOSE WHO SUSPECT A PROBLEM TO SEEK ASSISTANCE;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF MAY, 1981 TO BE

BETTER SPEECH AND HEARING

IN MINNESOTA, AND HAVE ASKED LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LOU WANGBERG TO PREPARE THIS PROCLAMATION FOR MY SIGNATURE AND DISSEMINATE THE SAME. FURTHER, I SUPPORT EFFORTS TO ENCOURAGE AND STIMULATE EARLY DETECTION, PROPER TREATMENT, PREVENTION AND GREATER UNDERSTANDING OF HEARING, SPEECH AND LANGUAGE IMPAIRMENT.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE HAVE HEREUNTO SET OUR HANDS AND CAUSED THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA TO BE AFFIXED THIS TWENTY-SECOND DAY OF APRIL IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY-ONE, AND OF THE STATE THE ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-SECOND.
