

Proclamation

WHEREAS: More than 125,000 Minnesotans are unemployed and thousands more are working in Low-paying jobs; and

- WHEREAS: UNEMPLOYMENT AND UNDEREMPLOYMENT RESULT IN PERSONAL HARDSHIPS, LOWER PRODUCTIVITY AND LARGE EXPENDITURES IN PUBLIC ASSISTANCE; AND
- WHEREAS: MANY UNEMPLOYED AND ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED MINNESOTANS HAVE TROUBLE FINDING EMPLOYMENT OR QUALIFYING FOR BETTER PAYING JOBS BECAUSE THEY LACK TRAINING AND WORK EXPERIENCE; AND
- WHEREAS: IN 1980, THE COMPREHENSIVE EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING ACT (CETA), AS ADMINISTERED BY LOCAL PRIME SPONSORS, PROVIDED JOB TRAINING FOR 52,500 MINNESOTANS WHO WERE UNEMPLOYED, LIVING IN POVERTY OR RECEIVING PUBLIC ASSISTANCE; AND
- WHEREAS: CETA'S ASSISTANCE RESULTED IN PEOPLE RECEIVING VOCATIONAL EDUCATION, WORK EXPERIENCE, JOB TRAINING AND COUNSELING THAT LED MANY OF THEM INTO PERMANENT JOBS AND INCREASED THEIR SELF-SUFFICIENCY;
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, ALBERT H. QUIE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, DO HEREBY PROCLAIM THE WEEK OF MAY 3 THROUGH MAY 9, 1981 TO BE
